## Principal's Report: J. Jacobson

## Courtesies:

### Faith Development:

- This year the theme for celebrating Catholic Education is Walking Forward Together and the Durham Catholic District School Board's theme is Community
- Each month the school will come together as a Catholic Learning Community to celebrate one of our Catholic Themes and to recognize our students, who have demonstrated growth in their faith journey
- Students will be recognized on Catholic Virtues and Catholic Graduate Expectation
- Collaborative Contributors was celebrated in September
- Discerning Believers will be celebrated in October
- Grade 4 bibles will be blessed during October (date to be determined)
- Monthly Rosary program will continue this school year
- December 11<sup>th</sup> will be the Advent Mass

### Health and Safety:

- There were a couple of Grade 3 and 6 students that were exempt from exams these students are included in the first set of results as a 0 which explains the increase between the All Students and the Participating Students for our school
- French immersion children in grade 3 only write the math portion of the EQAO
- Grade 3 writing appears to be low the results have been evaluated and it was determined that the students did very well in the multiple choice section and their thinking and organization was a strength, while editing and revising their work is an area requiring work, and the question around paragraph writing was found that the students consistently fell low in
- While the results are low for the grade 3 writing it is important to remember that this is the first year at St. Monica where the grade 3 English class is small as there is now a French immersion class
- The tests are revised annually so the more useful data will be when the grade 3 class reaches grade 6 and the cohort can be examined the rolling 3 year average does not show any significant issues

### New Business (30 Minutes)

### Annual Fundraiser: B. Boehm / N. Naassan

- The board sets out fundraising guidelines through their policy which must be followed
- The Dance-A-Thon will be the major fundraiser this year
- Initial letter, including a call out for donation of prizes, and pledge sheets will be sent home on Friday October 7th
- Goal of \$50 per student has been set
- Prizes to be determined but council will purchase an iPad mini and Beats headphones
- Incentive prizes will be awarded for milestones including \$9000 J. Jacobson will get a pie in the face and \$10000 J. Jacobson will be slimed
- There will be individual prizes and the class that raises the most money will get a free pizza day

### Music Program: J. Jacobson

- Board funds equally to 5 schools as a 1-2 ratio of instruments to students
- St. Monica typically has funded a 1:1 ratio in order to continue this ratio the music program will require \$700 be supplemented this cost will vary year to year
- The 1:1 ratio allows children to take home their instrument and practice
- Band performances are being looked at:
  - Dec 11<sup>th</sup> at Holy Redeemer Parish
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Show case of the Arts in April
  - Wonderland where children will perform and then have the opportunity to play on the rides
- Practices will be held one afternoon and one day after school each week
- J. Jacobson requested a motion to utilize council funds for the \$700 motion accepted by A. Lucas and second by S. McMurter

### Mrs. Wilkinson Transferring Schools: J. Jacobson/B. Povolo

- Mrs. Wilkinson will be transferring schools October 7<sup>th</sup>
- Gift from council will be presented Friday afternoon for anyone who can attend

#### **Open Question Period (10 Minutes)**

#### Board Concussion and Head Injuries Policy: N. Naassan/J. Jacobson

- N. Naassan asked for clarification around the board policy as a number of parents are concerned with the process
- If the board concussion and head injuries policy is implemented for a student then the student cannot return to school
  activities until a doctor completes forms to indicate that they are medically ok to continue the activities
- J. Jacobson explained that the policy has been in place for the past 2 years, is online, and is mandated by the ministry
- Any student wishing to play on any school sports team must have an informed consent which includes language around the concussion and head injury policy
- The policy is mandated by the ministry to be implemented when a student is experiencing any 1 of the following: pain at the site of impact, dizziness, vomiting, bump or bruising
- J. Jacobson will invoke the policy when a student is exhibiting symptoms related to a serious head injury, advise from a teacher observing the student, and/or the student themselves complaining of symptoms

#### French Books in Classrooms: K. David/J. Jacobson

- K. David indicated that the French immersion students do not have enough reading books/novels in the classroom library
- J. Jacobson The School Board funds the initial set up of school libraries and funds the initial set up for French Immersion classes. It is the responsibility of the school to support classroom libraries and Borrow a Book Program.
- It was originally thought that books would come from the French immersion program at Seaton as it is phased out Seaton does not have the resources that were originally expected at the lower grades – grade 5 resources are expected to be transferred from Seaton to St. Monica next year
- French books have been ordered
- It has been requested that council understand what the mandate is from the board vs council and have council consider resources for the French immersion students
